The PCS community was very gracious in extending me a six-month sabbatical after 16 years of service. I was, and I am, deeply appreciative. But given how active our community is, try as I might (and believe me I tried!) I just couldn't find a solid six-month window where I could imagine being away. So I want you all to know that what I'll be doing instead is taking a few chunks of extended time away over this next year. I want you to know what that will look like; what I hope to be doing when I'm not here; who'll be covering for me; how, and when.

So first of all, I want you to know that my plan is to be here for virtually all of our PCS benchmark events: the Spring Open House, the Fall Open House, the High Holidays; indeed all of our fall holidays; all of our Bar and Bat Mitzvahs (including another adult Bat Mitzvah this fall); our PCS Palooza Week; all of our Hebrew School Shabbatons; and, as I have done every year of late, I'll be in each of the classrooms this coming year for a session of "Ask the Rabbi." I'll also be teaching in the WAJE "Introduction to Judaism" class at the Rosenthal JCC; and teaching a three-part class of my own, "Do Jews Believe in Heaven?" (also at the JCC).

On the weeks I'm away Cantor Isabel Kopstein has agreed to lead Shabbat services, and to be on call for pastoral emergencies as she has been now over these many years whenever I've been away. Cantor Isabel will cover for me from June 23 through Selichot (the evening of August 31); and then again from October 27 through the Shabbat of Thanksgiving Weekend; and then again from December 1 through January 19; and then again from February 2 through the Shabbat of February 28/29. Please come out for services to support Cantor Isabel, and your PCS community!

So what will I be doing? Well, I hope to be spending most of my time writing. As some of you know, I was approached some years ago to write a book based on my 2008 CCAR Journal article on the Tetragrammaton. It's a project I dearly hope to complete. There are a few other writing projects as well.

What else? I may play a little more music, take a few more naps, and read a few more books than I might otherwise have gotten to read. All in hopes of returning to you as a somewhat more learned, somewhat more accomplished, somewhat more refreshed rabbi. We never know, of course, what the future holds. But these are my hopes and my intentions.

I want to thank the community again so much for allowing me this time. I look forward to sharing with you this fall "what I did on my summer vacation." If you're not too busy, please do come by the synagogue to say hello this month. Otherwise, b"h, I will see you all in September.

HEBREW SCHOOL HAPPENINGS



Dear PCS Family:

In our continuing effort to honor the many member families who participate in our vibrant community, we endeavor to call to the bimah representatives of as many families as possible to participate in our High Holiday services. Though it may seem early, planning for the coming Yamim Noraim requires much advance preparation.

Please see the form on the following page and mail/email/fax (769-1795) it to the synagogue office as soon as possible so that we may begin scheduling the honors that require it.

Individual Honors: English reading and Torah honors (holding, lifting or dressing the scrolls) are scheduled in advance of services. Please enter the name of each adult in your family with appropriate preferences. In consideration of your family's own High Holiday practices, you are also invited to enter a preferred day and time.

Teen Participation: We invite all of our teens - including those who celebrated their Bar/Bat Mitzvah this past year and those who will be celebrating in the coming year - to lead the community in the chanting of Ashrei during the Torah service on the first day of Rosh HaShana. It would be appreciated if those of you whose children will be participating in Ashrei would confirm this honor on the form as well.

Celebratory Group Aliyot: We will be calling to the bimah lay leaders and volunteers for celebratory group aliyot on the first day of Rosh HaShana, including all those students who recently became a Bar or Bat Mitzvah. All current members - men and women - who would customarily be eligible for an aliyah are welcome to participate. These are not scheduled in advance.

Torah Reading Honors: Reading from the Torah will be scheduled separately.

Thank you for your help during this important time in the spiritual life of our community.






A More Beautiful Sanctuary
