#### **By Mark Sameth**

One of the things I like most about Jewish tradition is the opportunity it gives us to do the very things we really, deeply, and truly wish to do. Whereas the secular New Year so often feels, to me, contrived, filled with false expectations and forced conviviality, the Jewish New Year has always struck me as hitting just the right note.

We all need the chance to begin again, and the Jewish New Year gives us that opportunity, but without all the whoop-de-doo. These are hard times, harder for some than for others, but hard for all of us nonetheless. And all of us are still looking for – and we're right to be looking for - positive signs; signs that things can get better for our families, the Jewish community, our country, and the world.

Rather than thronging together in Times Square, wearing funny hats, and blowing on a cheap noisemaker, we gather more solemnly, wear funny hats, and blow on the not-inexpensive horn of a kosher animal. OK, so maybe it's not as different as I thought. And yet there is a difference. The difference is in our intention and in our expectation.

When we say that we want things to be better, we say that in the context of a community that knows better than most, how hard – and how good - things can be. We say that in the context of a community that has always had as a core

value bettering its own lot (in the words of the Bruce Springsteen song, "We Take Care of Our Own") but also bettering the lot of everyone with whom we share this world, no exceptions. Finally, when we say that we want things to be better, we say it knowing that part of wanting things to be better has to do with changing external realities, and part has to do with managing internal realities.

There's a poignant scene in the Book of Deuteronomy that describes Moses pleading with God to let him see the Promised Land and to enter it. God seems to ignore Moses' plea. "Never speak to Me again about this matter!" But then the text goes on to tell how God instructs Moses to go up to the top of Mount Pisgah where he would be able to see the land. Half of Moses' request is indeed actually to be fulfilled. Much, though not all, of what Moses wants he gets.

Life is hard, filled with disappointment and sadness. But life is also filled with joy and many blessings, often unnoticed. The Jewish New Year allows us to reflect on these blessings, and yes to revel in them – without the whoop-de-doo – and then to dedicate ourselves again to making this a world where more folks have a greater share in the blessings we ourselves have been so fortunate to have known. *Shana tova u'metuka*! A good and sweet New Year to all!

#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As we approach the High Holidays, traditionally a time of the year when many of our thoughts turn to the fragility and precarious nature of life, we often think of maybe a meaningful aliyah or some other service to Hashem, our shul or community.

For me, my aliyah has always been, and continues to be, just being a member of this shul and this extraordinary community.

It has been an honor and a privilege to share a vision with so many others at PCS, of successfully growing our community in the ensuing years, while continuing to be an inclusive house of peace, faith, prayer, study, kindness and social awareness, in concert with our sense of Jewish history and heritage.

One of Judaism's greatest

strengths is that with our ever more transient and pressurized lives, it is very comforting and reassuring to have at least one aspect of our lives that is stable, continuous and unchanging, no matter what else transpires.

With Rabbi Mark and all of us working together, I very much look forward to the strategic opportunities, growth and maturation that lay ahead, and are an inherent part of any organization – religious or otherwise.

Most importantly, may this New Year bring what we so need – peace. Shana tova and may everyone be inscribed and sealed in the book of life for a wonderful and sweet new year ahead.

Individual Honors: English reading and Torah honors (holding, lifting or dressing the scrolls) are scheduled in advance of services. Please enter the name of each adult in your family with appropriate preferences. In consideration of your family's own High Holiday practices, you are also invited to enter a preferred day and time

Teen Participation: We invite all of our teens - including those who celebrated their Bar/Bat Mitzvah this past year and those who will be celebrating in the coming year - to lead the community in the chanting of Ashrei during the Torah service on the first day of Rosh HaShana. It would be appreciated if those of you whose children will be participating in Ashrei would confirm this honor on the form as well.

Celebratory Group Aliyot: We will be calling to the bimah lay leaders and volunteers for celebratory group

This summer, Under One Roof, the collaborative charitable effort by PCS and the Upper Westchester Muslim Society, had the pleasure of donating money raised from the goodness of our two communities to three very special recipients. As a result of the largesse of many generous people, we were able to contribute \$500 to Renaissance EMS, an after-school sanctuary for kids in the Bronx where they are taught music, dance and sports as an alternative to gangs and other destructive temptations that steal our youth. As well, we contributed \$500 to the Muslim Women's Institute, a full service provider to families of all faiths in the Bronx who are desperately in need of food and other basic services.
