From the founding of our synagogue almost 18 years ago, we have held ourselves out as a "big tent" community. Not affiliated with any one of the movements, we have sought inspiration from all them, and sought to welcome everyone.

That mission takes a big step forward this fall, as we inaugurate a new initiative, "Beyond Welcoming," with the support of UJA-Federation of New York. Perhaps you've seen our ads in the local newspapers and magazines, and on PEAK 107. The goal is simple: to make sure folks know that Pleasantville Community Synagogue welcomes the inter-married; to create spaces in the community for the inter-married to come together and talk about common interests and concerns; and to provide educational and experiential opportunities for folks who are not Jewish themselves but are partnered with Jews and/or helping to raise Jewish children, in which to learn about Judaism, to gain the knowledge and skills they need to better personally support their family's choice, and in the process, we hope, to draw strength and inspiration for themselves from this 4,000 year-old tradition.

If you know anyone you think might appreciate this opportunity – they don't have to be members of our community – please pass the word. We'll be kicking off a series of late Sunday morning (11:30 am to 1:00 pm) get-togethers - "Judaism for Non-Jews" - on October 26th. There's no charge, but RSVPs are appreciated.

Message from a Private Person

As many of you know, my husband, Itzik Mintz, died suddenly at the end of May. His brother lost his only sibling, and his many cousins and friends lost a vital and irreplaceable part of their lives. My children, Ella and Tal (young adults in college now but, of course, my babies) lost their beloved Abba, and I lost my partner of 30 years, my best friend. There is little need to elaborate on my family's profound sadness and devastation. It is there, and it will be there.

However...

What is also there, and what will be there, is an equally profound sense of gratitude and blessing. I knew we had family; I didn't quite know how completely amazing they are. I knew we had friends; I didn't know just how many and how extraordinary. I knew we had a synagogue of which we have been members for years, and I knew we had another synagogue where I work. Where I work: simple words that don't begin to sum it all up. Pleasantville Community Synagogue is where I have found meaningful work with good people, where I have found a balance between work and life and home and family, where I have found warmth and appreciation from every corner. What I did not know fully until now is that I had found a home here. I am a private person but I want to open my heart here to try to express my gratitude to this PCS community.

A Jewish proverb says, "He that can't endure the bad, will not live to see the good." I have endured the bad, and will continue to do so, and I have certainly lived to see the good. And there is so much good here. I don't know how to begin to thank the people who are PCS: to those of you who made sure we had a working refrigerator during those first terrible days, who came to the funeral, who came to my home, who sent meals, who wrote loving cards, who made heartfelt donations...and, in the end, who made sure that my children and I were taken care of. Acts of such profound and profoundly moving *chesed*, loving-kindness, it sometimes took my breath away. It all mattered; it all made a difference; it all helped.

This is a small place...and its heart is tremendous. I wish each and every one of you a most sweet and blessed New Year.


